They would work with UCI engineering students, as well as museum staff. Several Chapter 92 attendees have experience and knowledge with the Jenny. The museum will follow up with next steps.

Miscellaneous

- As a result of the new driving regulations on Chino airport, Janice will get a permit for us to use the tower transient parking area for people and vehicles during our YE events at Cal Aero.
- Chino airport is kicking off a program to develop the unused/undeveloped parcels.
