The month of June brings us into the "June Gloom" season of low clouds over the basin, especially as you get closer to the coast. Another incentive to get your IFR ticket, and a rare chance to practice flying in real clouds in the SoCal area.

Following the cancellation of our first Young Eagles event in March due to weather, our next two events at Planes of Fame/Cal Aero and Yanks Air Museum went very smoothly with good weather, a sufficient number of pilots, and enthusiastic Young Eagles and parents. We have one more event planned June 24 at Yanks Air Museum before we take a pause for the summer heat. Additional events in Sept and Oct will round out the year. We always have a need for more ground volunteers and pilots, so if you would like to work or fly at an event, please contact our Young Eagles coordinator, Steve Livingston at youngeagles@eaa92.org or sign up as a volunteer or pilot for chapter 92 at the yeday.org website. Be advised there is still road construction underway along Merrill Ave on the north side of Chino Airport, and Merrill is closed at Euclid, so you will need to follow detours to get to our Young Eagle venues.

The EAA Young Eagles program marks its 30th year in 2022-23, and has flown over 2.3 million youth world-wide to date. Please pass the word among your friends and neighbors and encourage the kids ages 8-17 to sign up for Young Eagles events with our chapter or with other chapters in the area.

We have had some excellent field trips recently organized by our VP, Martin Batelaan – one to the Orange County/John Wayne control tower, and one to the Long Beach Airport passenger terminal. We have another scheduled in June to visit the Flight Safety full-motion flight simulators at Long Beach. Attendance is limited for

#### **Grant award from the Parker-Hannifin Foundation**


EAA Chapter 92 has been granted an award from the Parker Hannifin Foundation. The focus of the Parker Hannifin Foundation is to support educational institutions, health care organizations, and various local charities. The Foundation supports organizations that are making a difference in the lives of Parker employees and the communities we call home.

These funds from the Parker Foundation will go towards two EAA Air Academy Summer Camp Scholarships for summer 2024. The scholarship will cover a full week of camp and transportation to Oshkosh, Wisconsin. We will select two candidates who demonstrate a strong interest in aviation. More information on page 18.

## **Young Eagles Events for 2023**

So far in 2023 we have held two Young Eagles events. The first one was on April 16th at Planes of Fame / Cal Aero where we have flown 29 Young Eagles with 6 pilots, and on May 13th at Yanks Air Museum where we have flown 38 Young Eagles with 5 pilots.

We have another event scheduled before the summer on June 24th at Yanks Air Museum, please go to our website <a href="www.eaa92.org">www.eaa92.org</a> for more details. Additional dates for Autumn events, expected to be in September and October, will be released later. We now have three Young Eagles event coordinators: Chris Cooper, Mike Spohn, and Steve Livingston are up to the task.

Last minute news: We're planning an additional Young Eagles event at Planes Of

Fame museum in Chino on July 1 as part of their Kids Aviation Day, along with their normal 1st Saturday presentations and warbird demo flight. Current plan is to do Walk-In only enrollments (i.e. no reservations) for the Young Eagles flights; Jim Barry will do the ground school presentation for the whole crowd; and the YE flights will be done after the warbird demo, with flights boarding and departing from the museum south gate. Entry to the museum is required and not 'free' for the YE activity.

Please note that volunteers get a polo shirt. The shirts are navy blue, are embroidered with the Young Eagle logo and 'EAA Chapter 92', and we have various sizes for men and women.

## **EAA Chapter 92 awarded GOLD Level Status**

EAA Chapter 92 has successfully reached the GOLD level status recognition level for the 2022 year. EAA National will provide a chapter recognition banner to be displayed where the chapter meets. The level will also be displayed online at EAA.org/FindAChapter with a specially designed emblem. This is our chapters second consecutive gold award.



Each chapter recognized as a Gold Level Chapter in 2022 displayed outstanding commitment to EAA by growing grassroots participation in aviation, as well as a desire to improve their chapter by using EAA-provided resources.

This program was developed and measured in partnership with EAA's Chapter Advisory Council and is based on 10 criteria that are consistently found in active and highly engaged chapters. An additional 11th criteria point was included to enable chapters to bring forward a chapter event or program which enhances their chapter by bringing more people to engage with their chapter. Each is worth a point, and there are three levels of recognition: bronze (7 out of 11), silver (8 out of 11), and gold (at least 9 out of 11).

Below are the qualifying Chapter Recognition criteria, along with our chapter's points.

A one (1) indicates that our chapter earned credit for the associated criteria:

- → Attends a chapter leadership training session: 1
- → Growing or steady membership: 1
- → Offers IMC or VMC Club programs: 1
- → Participates in Young Eagle or Flying Start programs: 1
- → Has EAA-approved Flight Advisor or Technical Counselor: 1
- → Participates in EAA's Annual Chapter Member survey: 1
- → Participates in Young Eagles Build and Fly, Young Eagles Workshops, Ray Aviation Scholarship program, or sends a youth to EAA's Air Academy: 0
- → Requests an EAA Chapter Blast email: 1
- → Hosts at least two public events each year: 1
- → Owns/leases a facility: 1
- → Extra credit activity, such as a chapter build project, youth build project, chapter scholarship, a chapter tool crib, IAC competition, etc.: 0

EAA Chapter 92, Inc.'s 2022 Chapter Recognition total is 9 out of 11.

## **EAA Young Eagles Workshops**

As an extension to our popular Young Eagles flights we are considering organizing Young Eagles Workshops. The EAA Young Eagles Workshops program provides an opportunity for EAA chapters to offer youth who are of school age (approximately 11 to 17) an opportunity to learn about aviation in a social setting at a local airport. EAA Young Eagles Workshops can be a one-day or a multiple day experience geared to introduce kids to the basic elements of airplanes and aviation.

So far we have secured a meeting room and have ordered preparation kits from EAA headquarters. If you or a kid you know might be interested in participating, please contact our Board member Peter Hurley at 350pete@gmail.com. We need to know if there is enough demand for such an activity.

## **EAA Build & Fly program**

The EAA Young Eagles Build and Fly program is an intensive RC model building and flying initiative to introduce youth to aircraft construction and the fundamentals of flight. This is a chapter modeling "program-in-a-box" designed for EAA chapters to partner with local Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) clubs to engage Young Eagles participants and other youth. The program can either be a follow-up to or lead to an EAA Young Eagles flight and is intended to further their passion for aviation.

So far we have kits material from EAA, but we need to re-ignite/plan project with Trabuco Flyers or other AMA group. If you or a kid you know might be interested in participating, please contact our Treasurer Steve Livingston at Treasurer@eaa92.org. We need to know if there is enough demand for such an activity.

EAA Chapter 96—Compton is already organizing such an event, and they're inviting our members and anyone interested to participate. **Please contact Peter Hurley at 350pete@gmail.com**.

## **Chino Airshow**

It has been confirmed that Chino airshow will not be conducted this year due to the extensive road construction in the Chino airport area. Next year's event is also in question due to event insurance concerns with newly developed residential area surrounding the airport.

Nevertheless, Planes Of Fame air museum will be hosting an <u>airshow at Santa Maria airport</u> (centralcoastairfest.com) on October 14 & 15th. It will be possible to fly-in for the day.

## **Looking for New Funding Sources**

EAA Chapter 92 made most of its revenues from the Brat Booth that we traditionally had at the Chino Airshow, but this has ended for the near future. So we have started looking for other sources of income for the Chapter. As of now we have increased EAA92 Chapter annual dues from \$20 to \$30, but that will not be enough to support all our activities. We need to explore additional funding sources for the future such that we can support Air Academy scholarship and other activities. We could use your inputs and ideas.

## Flight Simulator Donated to EAA Chapter 92

Colonel Keith D. Bushey has donated a flight simulator package (flight and engine controls, plus speakers) including X-Plane software to be used for educational purpose. Our own Treasurer Steve Livingston has donated a laptop to run the simulation program. We will make this flight simulator setup available at our Young Eagles events for our young eagles to practice their pilot skills ahead of their flights.

## **Young Eagles Youth Protection Program**

EAA's Youth Protection Policy and Program sets basic requirements for EAA staff and volunteers who work with children under age 18. It includes **online best-practices training** and, for certain categories of volunteers, a **basic background check** (U.S. residents only). All of the following persons are required to complete both the online training and background check.

Both steps are necessary and the cost is covered by EAA:

- → All Young Eagles pilots
- → All Chapter Young Eagles Coordinators and Field Service Representatives
- → Two-deep leadership supervisors (see Section 4 of the Policy)
- → Volunteers who will work with youth in general:
  - Four (4) hours or more at any one (1) time; or
  - Four (4) times or more in any calendar year; or
  - Four (4) times or more with any particular Youth.
  - Note that "Volunteers" includes, among others, parents and legal guardians of any youth participants

If you would like to volunteer for our next young eagles event, please use the link above and follow instructions.

To do the training and enter information for the background check you need to be a member of EAA National.

\* Our reason for these requirements is that kids should be safe, so we must take action to advance the safety of children in EAA-related programs – whether operated by EAA or by one of our chapters – for the sake of the kids, their parents and guardians, and the volunteers who work with them.

## In Case of Emergency at an EAA Chapter 92 Event

No matter how careful we are, there are times when things don't go as planned.

First and foremost: Make sure first aid and qualified medical personnel are immediately notified of any injury, and protect damaged property from any further damage.


- Date, time, and location of the incident
- Names, addresses, and telephone contact numbers for all injured persons
- Names, addresses, and telephone contact numbers for all witnesses

#### In addition:

- Have someone take immediate photographs of the incident if possible
- Don't discuss the facts leading up to the incident at any time with the news media
- Report the incident to a local FAA office or other government authority if applicable.
