"REVIVING HISTORY AT THE FLAM" UCI STUDENTS BUILD A 1918 CURTIS JENNY AIRCRAFT"



UCI ENGINEERING STUDENTS BUILD A "JENNY"

Given only a bunch of loose parts and blueprints, UCI students are building a replica WWI biplane, the Curtiss JN-4, "Jenny."

This remarkable initiative brings together undergraduate and graduate students in a collaborative effort to plan, organize, and construct a historically accurate replica of the iconic World War I aircraft.

Together with UCI professors and museum supervisors, students build the aircraft in an environment stressing STEM education, power and hand tool usage, metal work, and modern engineering processes.

Modern computer tools are engaged to design missing aircraft parts, create CNC profiles, and perform stress analysis to hang the Jenny from the museum ceiling.

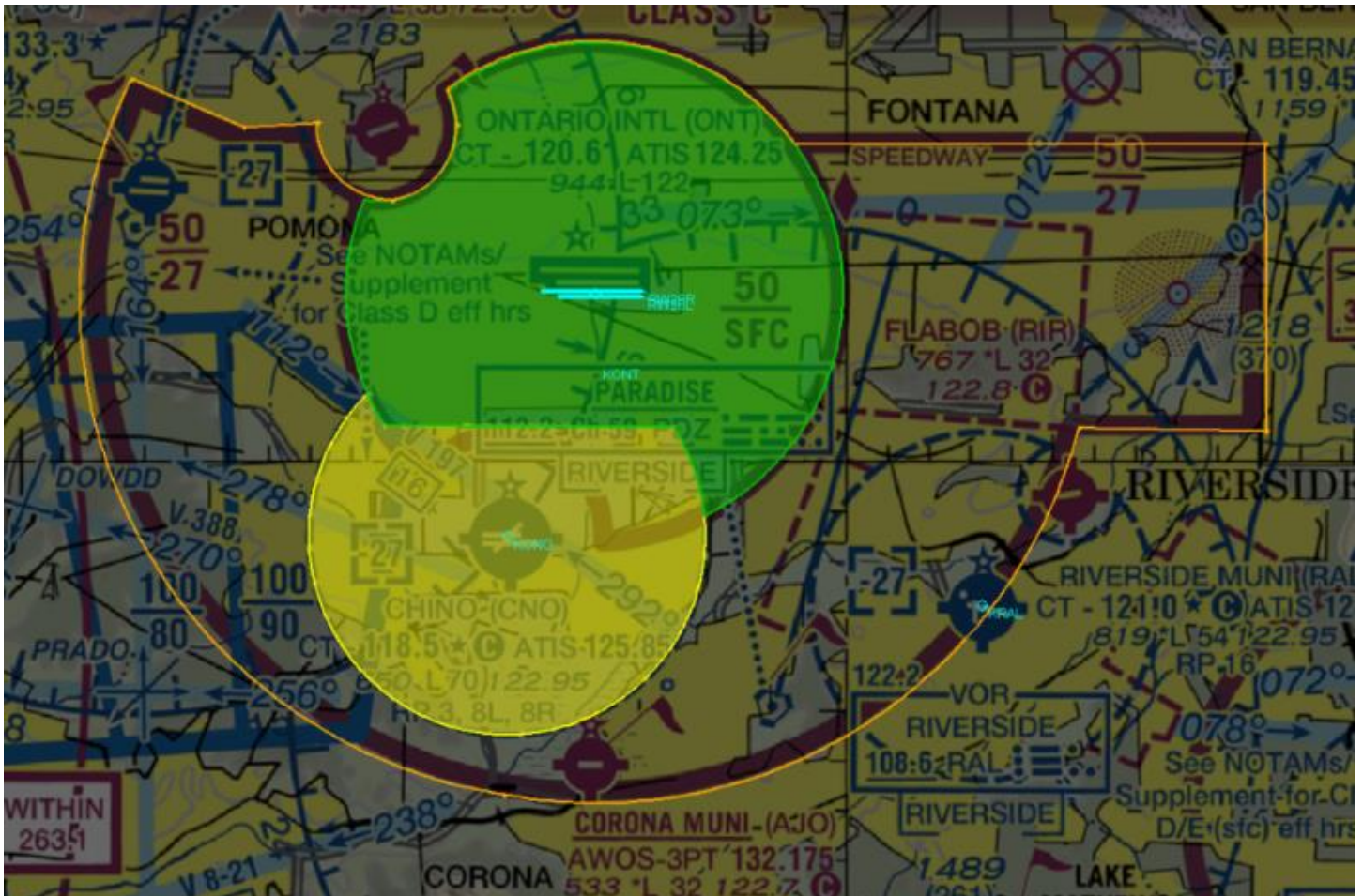

Modification to Ontario Class C airspace for Chino Airport

The FAA is beginning the formal process of modifying the ONT Class C airspace to reflect the Letter of Agreement that has been in place for some time between the ONT and CNO towers, which allows CNO tower to control CNO traffic in the SE corner of the ONT 5000 ft to surface airspace which is currently on the charts. That corner will get squared off and will become part of the ONT 5000 to 2700 foot airspace. They are currently setting up an ad hoc committee to coordinate with the pilot and airspace user community.

Air Academy Summer Camp Scholarship 2026

EAA Chapter 92 will be awarding two scholarships for the [EAA Air Academy Explore Aviation Camp](#), age 14-15, in Summer of 2026. This one week camp scholarship includes room and board at the Air Academy Lodge in Oshkosh Wisconsin. EAA Chapter 92 will reimburse a major part of the transportation air fare for the camper.

EAA Chapter 92 will be selecting candidates that have shown the most interest in aviation in a number of ways like; attending Young Eagles events, attending an aviation oriented high school program, volunteering at EAA Chapter 92 events like Young Eagles or attending the Chapter's monthly meetings. The scholarship recipient will have to present a short essay at one of our monthly EAA Chapter 92 meetings.

The scholarship applicants must have Parent or Guardian consent, and must be 14 or 15 years old in June 2026 because the camp educational material is designed for that age group. There is one scholarship for session 1: June 27 – July 2, and one scholarship for session 2: July 6 – July 11, 2026. To apply for the scholarship the applicant's parent/guardian must complete an [application](#) by February 20th 2026. Young Eagles Youth Protection Program

EAA's Youth Protection Policy and Program sets basic requirements for EAA staff and volunteers who work with children under age 18. It includes **online best-practices training** and, for certain categories of volunteers, a **basic background check** (U.S. residents only). All of the following persons are required to complete both the online training and background check.

Both steps are necessary and the cost is covered by EAA:

- ➔ All Young Eagles pilots
- ➔ All Chapter Young Eagles Coordinators and Field Service Representatives
- ➔ Two-deep leadership supervisors (see Section 4 of the Policy)
- ➔ Volunteers who will work with youth in general:
 - Four (4) hours or more at any one (1) time; or
 - Four (4) times or more in any calendar year; or
 - Four (4) times or more with any particular Youth.
 - Note that "Volunteers" includes, among others, parents and legal guardians of any youth participants

If you would like to volunteer for our next young eagles event, please use the link above and follow instructions.

To do the training and enter information for the background check you need to be a member of EAA National.

* Our reason for these requirements is that kids should be safe, so we must take action to advance the safety of children in EAA-related programs – whether operated by EAA or by one of our chapters – for the sake of the kids, their parents and guardians, and the volunteers who work with them.



EAA Chapter 92—Events Emergency Procedures

In Case of Emergency at an EAA Chapter 92 Event

No matter how careful we are, there are times when things don't go as planned.

First and foremost: Make sure first aid and qualified medical personnel are immediately notified of any injury, and protect damaged property from any further damage.

If there is an incident or accident at the event, please contact Steve Livingston 949.274.6489, Jim Randall 512.848.7251, Dan Green 949.304.0618, Jim Barry 912.480.7032 or lastly EAA Risk Management (contact info below), as soon as possible with the following information:

- Date, time, and location of the incident
- Names, addresses, and telephone contact numbers for all injured persons
- Names, addresses, and telephone contact numbers for all witnesses

In addition:

- Have someone take immediate photographs of the incident if possible
- Don't discuss the facts leading up to the incident at any time with the news media
- Report the incident to a local FAA office or other government authority if applicable.
